

UPS - Global Temporary Peak Surcharge – From 12th April 2020

Due to increased demand for air cargo capacity and the increased costs to maintain service during this emergency situation, UPS has decided to implement a global temporary peak surcharge.

For our European customers, this means that effective April 12, 2020 and until further notice, a temporary peak surcharge will apply to shipments originating from 19 countries in Europe¹ to anywhere in the world. The surcharge will also apply to import shipments coming into and invoiced in these 19 countries (e.g. import freight collect shipments), as well as shipments between third countries that are paid for in one of the 19 European countries.

Specifically, the surcharge will only apply to the following services:

- 1. UPS Worldwide Express^{®2}**
- 2. UPS Worldwide Express Freight^{®3}**
- 3. UPS Worldwide Expedited[®]**
- 4. UPS Transborder Express⁴**
